



# Sir Stirling Moss OBE - Memorial Service

8th May. 2024

Although four years have passed since we lost the great Sir Stirling Moss at the age of 90, due to Covid restrictions it has been until now not possible to give him an official memorial service.

In typical English style and respect, Westminster Abby was packed with over two thousand people. Royalty, the who's who of motor sports and celebrity paying homage to the great man's important contribution to motor racing but also his legendary status amongst the British people.

Stirling raced just about every brand and type of motor car and form of motor racing. He was an important part of Jaguar's racing history, winning in such cars as the XK 120 and the famous C Type just to name a few.

Ahead of the service a small selection of famous cars raced by Sir Stirling were positioned outside the Abbey. These included important cars from Jaguar and Mercedes.

At the start of the service, Sir Stirling's racing helmet, his Monaco trophy and his British Racing Club's Gold Stars were borne through the Abbey by British former racing driver Damon Hill and placed on the High Altar.

Sir Jackie Stewart and motor sports journalist Simon Taylor read tributes.

The service was conducted by the Dean of Westminster, the Very Reverend Dr David Hoyle, who said of Sir Stirling Moss:

"We remember the competitor who was ever the gentleman. We recall his rare talent and courage; that compelling ability that made him excel on the racetrack. "Movement is tranquillity" he said and lived out a long life with eager urgency.

We grieve for our loss as we celebrate all that he gave us. Here we will pray for those family members and friends who feel that loss most deeply and we will commend Stirling Moss to the God in whom we all have our beginning and our end".

May he rest in peace.

# NR24: More Cruisin' to Bruny Island


15th April, 2024



# JAGUAR CAR CLUB OF TASMANIA INC. HISTORY

The formation of the Jaguar Car Club of Northwest Tasmania began from an advertisement in "The Advocate" in May 1973. The first meeting was held at John Lamb's residence in Somerset on Saturday May 12th, 1973.

In that same year 1973, a group of Jaguar enthusiasts in the South, David Dungey, Roger Richardson, and Chris Riches were also promoting the idea of forming the Jaguar Car Club of Tasmania.

The inaugural meeting of The Jaguar Car Club of Tasmania was held in August 1973 at the St. Ives Hotel in Hobart and interest was sufficiently strong for the official Club to be formed on February 4th, 1974, with Chris Riches as the first president.

The first Club run was to Russell Falls National Park and soon after a gathering of cars for display took place at the historic township of Evandale. Early photographs of members cars were taken outside the Horseless Carriage Inn and at the Evandale Showground.

The Club conducted its first annual Concours D'Elegance at Westbury on November 9th, 1975, coinciding with the local Council's fair day at the same location. The setting was picturesque with Maypole dancing and other festivities, serving to bring an English spirit to the village green.

Amongst the Jaguars on display, Mark 2's, 1V's, V's, XK's and Mark 10's were the most prolific. Club membership at this time was 48 with 37 members displaying their cars. Following the Concours, there was a rapid increase in membership to 70.

From 1975 until 1980 the annual Concours was held at Westbury in November. In 1981 the venue and date were changed. The new venue was the attractive grounds outside of Parliament House. The historical waterfront setting was ideal, and the new location enabled the Saturday market goers and tourists to enjoy the spectacle of a Jaguar Concours.

At the February 1984 Concours almost 80 cars were on display from a membership over 100. Regular monthly meetings, social events and outings were held, and an impressive range of vehicles, including a rare SS1 touring car, XK 120's, XK 140's and a hand-built replica of a D Type racing car. The 10th Annual Concours was held in Launceston on February 16th 1985. Monthly meetings were held at the Traveller's Rest Hotel in Hobart.

Early Links with the Jaguar Car Club of Victoria were maintained for a long period of time whilst sharing the same magazine, "Cat a Log". However, it was decided to produce our own Tasmanian magazine, "Jaguar Torque". The first edition was produced in January 1997 by the then Editor Shevill Mathers and since inception our magazine has gone from strength to strength.
